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Opening Letter

Over the last several years we have seen a pattern of consistent growth. In 2021 we were a church of 450, we are now averaging over 1000 people in our weekly attendance and have more people regularly involved in groups than we had in the church in 3 years ago. It has been an incredible journey to see God moving and living being changed and we are honored to be a part of it. Our original idea for the Kingdom Campaign was a development of our property that didn't really account for the rapid rate of growth God is currently blessing us with. With that, we have been stepping back, and re-strategizing how to best glorify God while faithfully minister to the people He is bringing to us. While the concepts and vision of our For the Kingdom Campaign remain unchanged, what that looks like and how we are going about it have to. Instead of building a family building and then renovating our current worship center, the greater need is for a larger worship center.

We are looking to build a 1,200 seat worship center and then renovate our current worship center to become the family building we were originally looking to build. By the grace of God, this shift allows us to better care for the growth we are experiencing without increasing the overall cost of our Kingdom Campaign. We are so excited to see what God will do as we continue to follow Him. We are working on plans to: increase parking, build an office building so we can turn our offices into Children's classrooms which will allow us more space for Family Ministry while keeping all the kids under the same roof, ordering more chairs for the auditorium, and adding a 3rd service. We hope as you read this report you will be as encouraged, excited, (and maybe moved to help us by joining one of our serve teams or leading a group) as we are.







2025 Total Budget: \$1,153,777



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Not everyone who needs the Gospel is ready to walk through the doors of a church and hear it. We desire to be a place that helps minister to people where they are and allows us to share Jesus in the process. Our plan is to build out our campus to maximize these opportunities. Originally, our focus was building spaces to serve different areas of ministry. Due to the growth God has been blessing us with, how we are approaching some of these spaces has changed. Our plan is to build a new, 1,200 seat Worship Center, renovate our current worship building to make an expanded and improved Family Ministry Center--which will also house our new Student Center and additional adult classrooms/meeting spaces. Our existing Student Center building will be renovated to house our Freedom Center (for meeting people's emotional and mental needs), and Outreach Center (for meeting their physical and practical needs). We plan to build a new sports building, and a residence.

The estimated total completion of the project is \$15 million. Our plan is to approach this journey in milestones. The first mile-marker is estimated to be completed at \$4.5-5 million.
